Dr. Falletta: Founder and Devoted Friend of RMH



As a pediatric oncologist, John Falletta knew sick children need family-centered care.

With this in mind, Dr. Falletta began the process of organizing the volunteer leadership to open the state's first Ronald McDonald House. The year was 1978, and Dr. Falletta understood how crucial this decision would be to tens of thousands of families across NC and beyond in the years to come.

Dr. Falletta shared his idea of family hospitality with a local mother, Carolyn Ketner Penny, whose daughter he was treating.

"I knew very well how hard it is to be the parent of a young cancer patient. To travel from out of town for treatment places an extra burden on parents who already face so much," Penny recalls.

Carolyn and Dr. Falletta went to work rallying support for the first NC hospitality house for families of sick children. It was incorporated as Pediatric Family Center of NC and soon after became Ronald McDonald House.

From the start, Dr. Falletta's focus on family-centered care reflected his values and his insistence that patients and their entire families be known and understood by their physicians.

In order to care for somebody, you have to care about them. You have to understand the challenges that they're facing.

This philosophy would follow him throughout his career. (Continued)

He was respected locally and globally as a caring physician and humble leader.



Steele's family stayed at Ronald McDonald House in Palo Alto so they could be near him when he was in the hospital. Sarah even joined them at Ronald McDonald House.

When she moved to the Triangle, Sarah looked for ways to pay forward the hospitality her family was shown during Steele's health crises. You'll find her on Friday mornings at Ronald McDonald House of Durham, welcoming families as a front-desk volunteer. Sarah understands personally how meaningful a kind smile and a kind word can be to families as they begin their day.

Fast forward ten years, and Steele is starting fifth grade. He faces future surgeries, including a possible heart transplant. For now, he enjoys golf and video games, and he loves math.

Finley's family stayed at Ronald McDonald House for 88 days while she was in the hospital.

Born with Down syndrome and weighing just two pounds, Finley faced multiple challenges. Her father Tim, a US Army Aviation Operations Officer, shared, "One of the reasons the doctors said that Finley came home at all was because both Ashley and I were able to be there every day – every time the medical team did the rounds, every time she needed a bottle feed we [could] be there."




